# UNIVERSITI MALAYA AT A GLANCE

## History

Established in 1905 as the King Edward VII College of Medicine in Singapore, Universiti Malaya (UM) became a full-fledged university in 1949 with the merger of this college and Raffles College. It expanded rapidly, leading to the establishment of two autonomous divisions in 1959—one in Kuala Lumpur and one in Singapore. In 1962, UM became Malaysia's national university.

UM's first Chancellor was Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj, Malaysia's first Prime Minister. Today, His Royal Highness Sultan Nazrin Muizzuddin Shah, the Sultan of Perak, serves as UM's Chancellor.

#### Key Concepts Covered:

- English for Communication: Enhancing speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills.
- Academic and Professional English: Developing skills for presentations, reports, and structured discussions.
- Cross-Cultural Understanding: Exploring Malaysian and global cultural perspectives to foster intercultural awareness.
- Pronunciation & Fluency: Building speech clarity and conversational confidence.
- Language in Context: Understanding idiomatic expressions, social interactions, and cultural nuances in English-speaking environments.
- Applied Learning: Engaging in group discussions, presentations, and campus interaction with Malaysian students for real-world language application.
- Introduction to Pharmacy & Healthcare English: Exposure to basic English terminology and communication styles used in healthcare and pharmaceutical contexts, enhancing interdisciplinary vocabulary and awareness of Malaysia's pharmacy education and healthcare system.

#### Date of Withdrawal Programme Fee Refund (%)

(a) If cancellation occurs fourteen (14) days or more before the Programme start date, fifty percent (50%) of the total programme fee per participant shall be refunded.

(b) If cancellation occurs less than fourteen (14) days before the Programme start date, no refund shall be provided, as logistical and academic arrangements would have been finalised.
